Basic RiderCourse (BRC)

The Basic RiderCourse (BRC) is aimed at beginning riders of all ages. A minimum of five hours classroom instruction prepares the student for at least ten hours of practical riding in a controlled, off-street environment—typically, a parking lot.

Motorcycles and helmets are included in your course fee. Most motorcycles used in the course are loaned by local dealers.

You will learn how to operate a motorcycle safely, with a lot of emphasis on the special skills and mental attitude necessary with dealing with traffic.

Your RiderCoaches are certified by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation. They will start you off with straight-line riding, turning, shifting and stopping. You will gradually progress to cornering, swerving and emergency braking.

In the classroom, you will learn about the different types of motorcycles, their controls, and how they operate. The course concludes with a knowledge test and a skill evaluation. You will smile with satisfaction as the Rider-Coach hands you that course-completion card.

Eligibility

- Must be 16 years of age or older (parental consent required for 16 & 17 year olds).
- Must be able to ride (balance) a bicycle before attempting on-cycle exercises

General Information

All classes begin in Room 142 of the Anderson Technical Building on West Kentucky Community & Technical College's campus in Paducah. Be prepared to ride the first meeting. On-cycle exercises will be ridden at the adjacent west end driving range.

Cancellations

Cancellations must be made two weeks in advance of the class starting date. Refunds generally take four to six weeks to process. Failure to attend class does not constitute cancellation. The college reserves the right to cancel any program. You will be notified of any cancellation and will receive a full refund.

Class Sizes

Class sizes are limited so early registration is encouraged.

Insurance Discounts

Many insurance companies offer discounts on motorcycle premiums to students who have successfully completed a RiderCourse. Be sure to ask your insurance agent.

Liability Waivers

Liability waivers will be required of all course participants. Those under 18 years of age must have a waiver signed by a parent or guardian before taking the course.

Licensing-Test Waivers

Successful completion of the RiderCourse results in waiver of the motorcycle license skill test in Kentucky. Over 20 states waive some portion of your motorcycle endorsement test if you've completed a RiderCourse.

Protective Clothing Required

NOTE: The following items must be brought to every scheduled class period, including the first class.

- Footwear -sturdy over-the-ankle (not cloth or canvas)
- Long Pants -denim or heavy material
- Gloves -full fingered, leather preferred
- Long sleeved Jacket or Shirt -wrist length of denim or heavy material
- Eye Protection -sunglasses or prescription lenses for your convenience
