Notifications are sent out each semester as a reminder to advise employees and students of keeping vehicles locked and not leaving personal property unattended.

A campus-wide e-mail will be used to notify campus employees and students. Depending on the severity of the incident, a SNAP Emergency Alert message will be issued via cell phone to employees and students enrolled in the SNAP Program. Faculty will be asked to notify students in their classes as well.
